Dr. Theodore (Ted) E. Warkentin, MD, BSc(Med), FRCP(C), FACP, is a clinical and laboratory hematologist and transfusion medicine director at Hamilton General Hospital, and is a Professor in the Department of Pathology and Molecular Medicine, and the Department of Medicine, at McMaster University, in Hamilton, Ontario, Canada.

He has published in excess of 50 articles, as well as book chapters, primarily in the area of lymphoid neoplasia, and serves as an ad hoc reviewer for several international journals.

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KEYNOTE SPEAKERS - NURSES



Tracy King PhD, MN, RN

Myeloma Clinical Nurse Consultant, Royal Prince Alfred Hospital, NSW

Clinical Associate Professor, Research Fellow & Lecturer Cancer Nursing Research Unit, Faculty of Medicine and Health, Sydney University.

Tracy King is a Myeloma Clinical Nurse Consultant (CNC) at Royal Prince Alfred

Hospital; Clinical Associate Professor, Research Fellow and Lecturer at the Cancer Nursing Research Unit, Sydney University. With over 30 years' experience in the field of Haematology / BMT, Tracy developed a specialist interest in myeloma 25yrs ago working with the International Myeloma Foundation (IMF), now Myeloma UK. Since coming to Australia Tracy has been an active member of a range of national and international professional working groups including those of the Cancer Institute NSW; steering committee member of the Myeloma and Related Disease Registry (MRDR), founding Chair of the HSANZ Myeloma Special Practice Network (M-SPN) and Past President and co-founder of the HSANZ Nurses Group. Tracy is an invited member of the IMF Nurse Leadership Board (NLB); the Myeloma UK Nurse Advisory Group and leads the nurse's program development and delivery during the International Myeloma Workshop (IMW). Tracy completed a master's in nursing leadership and was recently awarded her PhD with Sydney University. She was awarded the Outstanding Research Achievement Nursing & Midwifery Award 2019 by Sydney Local Health Network (SLHD) for her leadership and research in better understanding the experiences of those affected by myeloma taking high dose steroids and the role of patient reported outcome measures (PROM).



Simone Sheridan

Sheridan (she/they) Simone is a passionate nurse consultant, educator and social-justice advocate who thrives in roles where difficult conversations are required. Simone has a clinical background in intensive care (Peter MacCallum) and has completed postgraduate studies in critical care and clinical teaching. Over her diverse career she has been part of a family violence

project team, designed LGBTIQA+ inclusive practice resources, and provided staff support during the pandemic. In her role as Sexual Health Nurse Consultant Simone regularly facilitates education for health professionals about the importance of sexual health and supports clients experiencing sexual changes as a result of illness or injury. For many years, Simone has spoken out about the issue of sexual harassment in healthcare. In 2019 she co-authored a piece called "Not our job; A nurse's story of sexual harassment by patients" which was published an in Australian anthology of #MeToo stories, as well as on the ABC – the national broadcaster of Australia. Simone and her work were also the subject of a 2021 book "The Care Factor" by author Ailsa Wild. Simone has recently commenced a new role at The Royal Melbourne Hospital as the first Sexual Safety Nurse Consultant.

Gordon Cook MB ChB, PhD, FRCP(Glas), FRCPath

Professor of Haematology - Leeds Institute of Medical Research, University of Leeds, Leeds Cancer Centre, Leeds Teaching Hospitals Trust. Clinical Director, Haematology - Leeds Institute of Clinical Trial Research, University of Leeds. Clinical Director, NIHR (Leeds) Medtech & IVD Cooperative - Leeds Cancer Centre, Leeds Teaching Hospitals

Trust. Dean - College of Myeloma (UK). Honorary VisiAng Professor - Department of Health Sciences, University of York.

I am a graduate of the University of Glasgow School of Medicine & received my higher professional training in haematology in the West of Scotland. A?er completion of my PhD, I was appointed as a Consultant Haematologist in the West of Scotland before moving to take up the post of Director of Stem Cell Transplantation at Leeds Teaching Hospitals in 2002. In 2013 I was appointed as Professor of Haematology, University of Leeds where I lead the myeloma clinical and translational research programme with a primary interest in tumour immunology and immunotherapy.

I was the founder & first Chair of the UK Myeloma Research Alliance, having stepped down in 2019. I am the past-chair of the UK Myeloma Forum and have established the College of Myeloma (UK) which elected its first fellows in 2019. I have represented the interests of both myeloma clinicians and pa@ents in National Institute of Clinical care & Excellence reviews and technology appraisals and am a current commiYee member of the NHS England Chemotherapy CRG.

I have developed and delivered an extensive national clinical research porZolio. Currently I am Chief Investigator for NCRI Myeloma X (completed), UKMRA Myeloma XII (in recruitment), UKMRA Myeloma XIV (in recruitment), MUKeight (completed) and MUKeleven (finished). My collaboration with industry includes my positon as the UK Chief investigator for 5 industry international phase III and IIIb studies.

I hold the posts of Clinical Director of National Institute of Health Research (Leeds) Medtech & In Vitro Diagnostics Cooperative and Clinical Director (Haematology), Clinical Trials Research Unit, University of Leeds.



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
